## Geography

It was led by Spain and Portugal. In 1530, Portugal established its first colony in Brazil. Colonists created sugarcane plantations along the coast. They also sent diamonds and gold back to Europe. Not long after, people from West Africa were brought to Brazil as slaves. The slaves had to harvest sugarcane and mine for gold. The discovery of large inland gold brought thousands of people as far away as Europe to the interior of Brazil to come mine for gold. May years later, in 1789, Brazilians tried to kick out their Portuguese rulers. This didn't end up working, but it started a movement towards independence. By 1822, Brazil was a ruler nation. This means that Kings of Portuguese bloodline ruled until 1888. Military leaders and landowners banished the king, and Brazil became a federal republic in 1888.


#### Culture
