

- The deepest point in the Atlantic Ocean (Milwaukee Depth)which lies within Puerto Rico's trench (Depth 27,493).

- There were many interactions between the native Taino, Spanish, African culture. These culture are seen in modern day Puerto Rico.
- The Taino people began to die out in the 16th century because of an infections disease carried by Europeans, Spanish settlers, warfare.
- In 1908 during the Spanish-American war, Puerto Rico was invaded and claimed by United States.
- When Christopher Columbus there were an estimated 30-60 thousands Taino's led by a chief "Agveybana"





What are some interesting facts about its culture?



- Puerto Rico culture is a blend of Taino and Spanish settlers, African culture.
- During the 18th century early Spanish settlers and Taino native became married. Later on African slaves were imported to help with farming and building roads. Followed by the importation of Chinese immigrants then continued with the arrival of Italians, French, German, Lebanese people.
- The most significant new immigrant population was in 1960 when thousands of Cubans fled from Fidel Castro's Communist state.
- Puerto Rico's food reflects strong Spanish, African American influence. When Christopher Columbus came to Puerto Rico he introduced meat, rice, wheat, oil product.
- Puerto Rico celebrates the birthday of Eugenio Maria de Hostos this birthday is on the second Monday of January this official holiday of the people. If you don't know who he is he was a writer, statesman, he also fought for independence, he was also and educator, philosopher, lawyer, sociologist. He was an advocate for ending slavery in the late 1800.
