- Koreans tend to value obedience to family, hard work, and protection of the family.

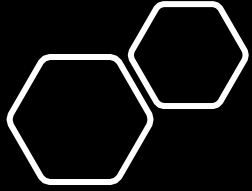


What do you like best about South Korea?
