





## Haiti's History

- Haiti was the first independent black republic in the world.
- They achieved their freedom by defeating Napoleon and the French colonists, who were holding slaves hostage to grow profitable crops on the island.
- The Haitian people managed to overthrow the French at the Battle of Vertiéres at the end of 1803 and became a free country unruled by the French during the start of 1804. This made them the first country known to get rid of slavery and one of the first known slave revolts in world history.
- Haiti is the poorest country in the world, but was once one of the richest. The country's wealth was gone after paying off debts to the French.

### Culture

 Music- the people of Haiti created the merengue musical style, which incoroporates a slow African drum beat and 1800s European dance music. It has become with many people in the Latin Americas and in the Caribbean; They also enjoy other music styles such as "Voodoo Beat", Kompa, Twoubadou, and may others.

• Literature - Most of the books and literature written in Haiti are written in French, although some are written in creole. French and creole are the most common language spoken in Haiti.

- Cuisine Food in haiti was orginally a mix of cuisines from the french, the spanish, the africans, and the taino (first settlers on haiti which later went exctinct around the 1550s due to dieases brought by the spanish).
- Spirituality With a population just over 11 million people, Haiti is the the first country to hold voodoo as high as other more common religons such as Roman Cathlocism (a religon transported and taught in haiti by the french people) and protestant Christianity. As of 2020, about 2.1% of Haiti's people practice voodoo.

- Mountain Ranges Haiti has many moutain ranges streaching from east to west; some of the largest include Massif du Nord, the Cordillera Septentrional, the Matheux Mountains and the Massif de la Selle.
