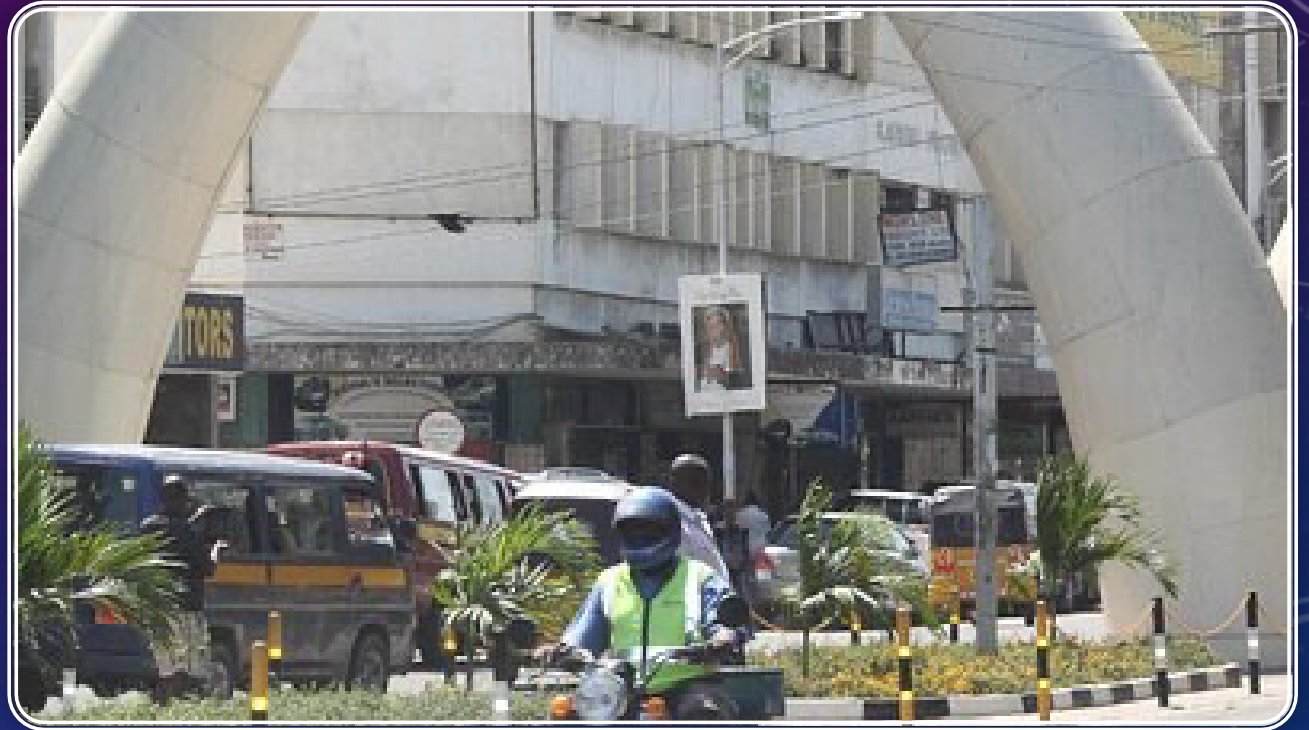

- You can witness the result of earths splitting force.

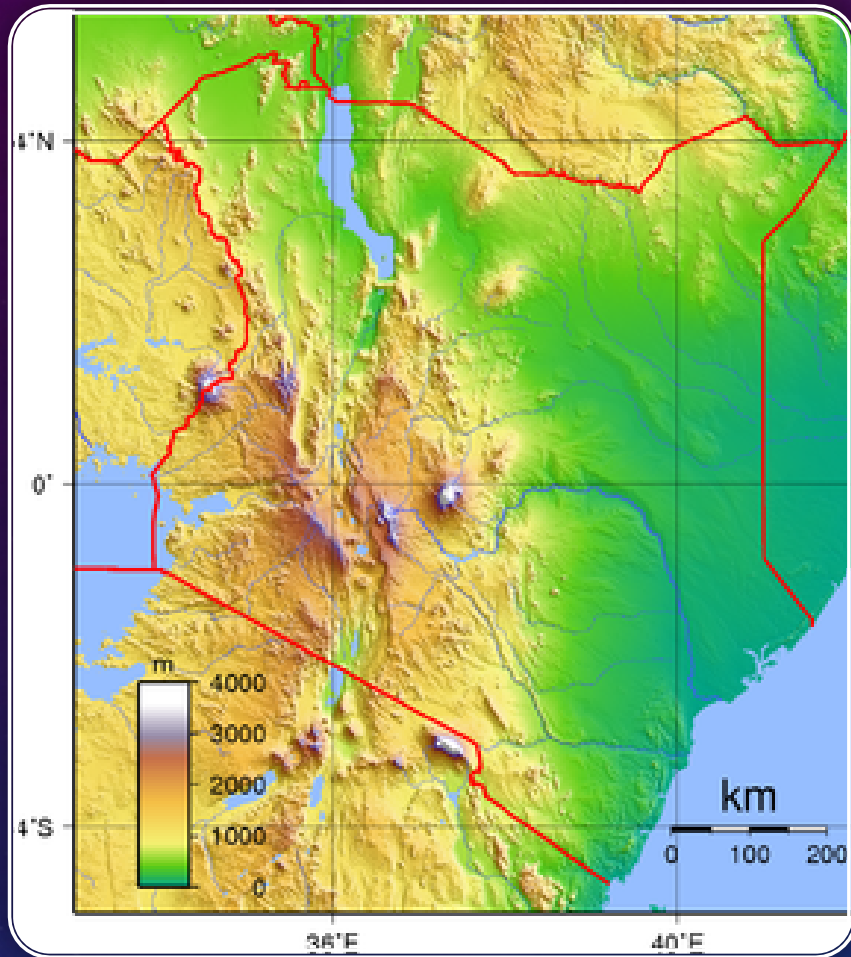


# HISTORY
